The Rosary

Pope Benedict XVI has asked Catholics to pray daily Rosaries.

The Basic Rosary

1. Holding the crucifix, make the Sign of the Cross.

2. Holding the fifth bead up from the crucifix, announce the first mystery, then pray the Our Father. Pray 10 Hail Marys, one on each bead, while meditating on the mystery. End with: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

3. Continue with the second, third, fourth and fifth mysteries in the

5. End with the Sign of the Cross.
