#### WEDDING ROSARY: FRESHWATER PEARL



# SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION WALL CROSS


This wall cross depicts the three sacraments of initiation — baptism, Eucharist and confirmation — with the Scripture "I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord" (Jeremiah 29:11). At the bottom is also depicted the sacrament of reconciliation, which is generally received in preparation for first Communion. This wall cross is made of a resinstone mix and is painted bronze. # Year of Mercy Aids and Tools

Good Reads and Views for The Special Jubilee

YEAR OF MERCY

he Jubilee Year of Mercy presents everyone with a life-changing moment, but no one should set out on a momentous journey without the proper directions and tools. Several are readily available to get the most out of this special year.

Doors of Mercy is a formation program designed for everyone from daily Massgoers to inactive Catholics.

"It can also be done by a family, Bible study, men's and women's groups, Knights of Columbus councils — the sky is the limit, in terms of a group," said Father Jeffrey Kirby, who appears on each DVD as the host of the eightpart series and is one of the presenters.

"The main goal is to share the covenants of salvation history in light of Divine Mercy, highlighting how much God has shown his mercy to each one of us," added Father Kirby, an author and the Diocese of Charleston, S.C., vocation director.

Joining him as presenters on the other DVDs are Father Chris Alar of the Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception, authors Paul Thigpen, Rose Sweet and Joseph Pearce, and Mary-Rose Verret, co-founder with her husband Ryan of "Witness to Love: Marriage Preparation Renewal Ministry."

The Doors of Mercy program from St. Benedict's

Press (MercyStudy.com) walks participants through God's revelation up to this special time of mercy. The five great covenants of the Bible are covered, beginning with Adam and Eve and proceeding to Jesus opening the doors of mercy on the cross and the revelation of Divine Mercy to St. Faustina.

The program examines such areas as how the sacraments are necessary for mercy and conversion of heart. The presenters give insights showing the power of Divine Mercy and how God reveals his mercy in ordinary and extraordinary ways.

As Father Alar explained, "God is saying, 'I want to share my love in these covenants with man — culminating in the New Covenant of Jesus Christ. Please turn back to me.' Faustina was able to reiterate that message, yet bring in new devotions to help us understand in a practical way God's mercy."

Father Kirby explained that each lesson or session "explains the practical ways each lesson can be lived," he said. "After each lesson, there's immediate application." For instance, one area deals with reconciliation of marriage and harmony within the family.

Father Kirby emphasized the overall program goal is "to present [the idea of] covenant in light of mercy and provide a program of mercy for the participants, so they can really live as a people for mercy during this jubilee year. This is a fully prepared

program to help a parish (or group) really live the jubilee year. We don't want the jubilee year to pass anyone

Beautiful Mercy from Matthew Kelly (DynamicCatholic.com) is another excellent companion for the jubilee.

Subtitled Experiencing God's Unconditional Love So We Can Share It With Others, this book follows each of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy through the insights of more than 25 well-known Catholics.


Jack Beers, Dynamic Catholic's spokesman for this book and team leader of first Communion and first reconciliation initatives, describes it as readable and practical, since each chapter is written by a different author and runs no more than 1,200 words. "You can always pick it right back up without feeling like you're lost," he said.

Beers said Beautiful Mercy is an excellent companion to help celebrate this Year of Mercy to full ben-

"Reading this book will cause you to see the world through the lens of God's incredible mercy," he noted. "You will encounter the mercy of God personally and receive simple, tangible and practical ways to extend the mercy you have received to others."

As Beers reflected, "For the most part, we don't realize what we should have done or could have done until the moment has passed. This book will give you the presentmoment awareness you need to, let's say, recognize that someone is in a state of affliction, and it will give you the tools to know when comforting that afflicted person means simply listening, encouraging or spending quality time."

He recommends people read a chapter every day and then ask God to show them how they might live out that work of mercy during the day ahead. The book can be used effectively for parishes, small groups and individuals, Beers explained. "The works of mercy inspire readers to realize that



time of mercy is not. Jesus told St. Faustina, 'Now is the time of mercy. ... If you don't pass through the doors of my mercy, you must pass through the doors of my justice."

Father Alar underlined the need "now" for this time of mercy. He observed that "Pius XII said in the 1950s mankind is more sinful than at the time of the Flood. In the 1950s, we didn't have legalized abortion, the birth-control pill, pornography on demand or gay marriage. What would Pius XII call [society] today if he saw it?"

"There's no question that today we are more lost than the Israelites in the desert," Father Alar said. "We have the fullness of revelation in Christ, which they didn't yet. God keeps flooding us with grace and mercy, and the Pope is trying to wake us up. God is giving us every opportunity to turn back to him. This is the time of mercy, and we have to use this opportunity to turn back to God."

You Did It to Me: Putting Mercy Into Action is a five-part series that aired on EWTN during December

In the opening, Father Gaitley says, "I think many of us are intimidated by the works of mercy, and we're afraid to embrace them as a way of life because we think they're going to be difficult or complicated. But they're not."

Father Gaitley summarizes the corporal and spiritual works of mercy under the umbrella of the five scriptural works of mercy and shows how they fit there. "This is the way we will be judged," said Father Alar, referring to Jesus making clear what we need to do to get to heaven: Feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty; welcome the stranger; clothe the naked; comfort the sick; and visit those in prison (Matthew 25:31-46). This series clearly shows how to be merciful to others.

The Divine Mercy in the Second Greatest Story Ever Told series available with or without workbook — is true to Father Gaitley's bestselling book of similar title.

God has been constantly

reminding us of his mercy. And, in the 20th century, he raised up St. Faustina and gave her five new channels of grace, "new ways to understand the message of mercy which is timeless," Father Alar said. These include the feast of Divine Mercy, the image of Divine Mercy, the Divine Mercy novena, the 3 o'clock hour of mercy and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Overall, Divine Mercy in the Second Greatest Story Ever Told spotlights mercy in our times, connecting it with Fatima and the witnesses of Sts. Maximilian Kolbe, Faustina and John Paul II.

Both series (available at Shop-Mercy.com) have "a beautiful way to synthesize long, verbose topics into a way a 12-year-old or a 90-yearold can easily understand," according to Father Alar.

33 Days to Merciful Love is the newest book by Father Gaitley. Subtitled A Do-It Yourself Retreat in Preparation for Consecration to Divine Mercy, it's a sequel to 33 Days to Morning Glory and uses the same 33-day preparation format.

The book is a consecration to Divine Mercy in the style of St. Thérèse of Lisieux, one of the most beloved saints. Father Gaitley writes that "it follows the theology of her 'Offering to Merciful Love,' which is essentially a consecration to Divine Mercy." He further explains that "her Offering to Merciful Love is really the culmination of her whole spiritual teaching on the Little Way, the crowning of her path to holiness."

In his conversational style, Father Gaitley leads readers to the same consecration.

Bishop Edward Scharfenberger of Albany, N.Y., has endorsed the book (ShopMercy.com). "It's an answer to all those who want to do something about that 'personal relationship with Jesus Christ,' which sometimes sounds more like a flowery fantasy for cherubs on clouds," he wrote.

"This is not a book for angels, but for the ordinary little person in each of us - including clergy, scholars, and bishops. ... It opens hearts, including my own, to a fuller meaning of Divine Mercy (with the help of St. Thérèse of Lisieux)." Joseph Pronechen is the






