

## **Questionnaire Sources**

he Catholic Identity College Questionnaire offers objective questions about a university's Catholic identity. We designed the questionnaire so that a "YES" answer reflects essential elements of the renewal of Catholic identity called for by Pope St. John Paul II's 1990 apostolic constitution on higher education, Ex Corde Ecclesiae (Out of the Heart of the Church), its 2000 "Application to the United States," canon law and other relevant Church documents.

#### The Institution

■ **President's Oath:** Canon 833: The president of a Catholic university is personally bound to make a profession of faith, according to the formula approved by the Apostolic See, in the presence of the chancellor or diocesan bishop or a delegate at the beginning of the term of office.

The Profession of Faith and the Oath of Fidelity, "Acta Apostolicae Sedis" 1989: The obligation of a special oath of fidelity has been extended to presidents of Catholic universities.

- Catholic Board: U.S. Application: To the extent possible, the majority of the board of trustees should be Catholics committed to the Church.
- Catholic Faculty: U.S. Application: The university should strive to recruit and appoint Catholics as professors so that, to the extent possible, those committed to the witness of the faith will constitute a majority of the
- Mandatum Required: Canon 812: It is necessary that Catholic theologians have a mandatum from the diocesan bishop.

Pope John Paul II (to American bishops, 2004): "By their very nature, Catholic colleges and universities are called to offer an institutional witness of fidelity to Christ and to his word as it comes to us from the Church, a public witness expressed in the canonical requirement of the manda-

U.S. Application: Both the university and the bishops, aware of the contributions made by theologians to Church and academy, have a right to expect them to present authentic Catholic teaching. Catholic professors of the theological disciplines have a corresponding duty to be faithful to the Church's magisterium as the authoritative interpreter of sacred Scripture and sacred Tradition.

U.S. Application: Catholic students have a right to receive from a university instruction in authentic Catholic doctrine and practice, especially from theologians.

Mandatum Text: "I hereby declare my role and responsibility as a teacher of a theological discipline within the full communion of the Church. As a teacher of a theological discipline, therefore, I am committed to teach authentic Catholic doctrine and to refrain from putting forth as Catholic teaching anything contrary to the Church's magisterium."

U.S. Application: If a particular professor lacks a mandatum and continues to teach a theological discipline, the university must determine what further action may be taken in accordance with its own mission and statutes.

■ Theologians' Oath: Canon 833: Catholic theologians are personally bound to make a profession of faith, according to the formula approved by the Apostolic See, in the presence of the university president if he is a priest, or the diocesan bishop or a delegate, at the beginning of their term of office.

The Profession of Faith and the Oath of Fidelity, "Acta Apostolicae Sedis" 1989: The obligation of a special oath of fidelity has been extended to Catholic theology professors.

#### **Campus Culture**

- Mass and Confession: U.S. Application: Catholic students have a right to be provided with opportunities to practice the faith through participation in Mass, the sacraments, religious devotions and other authentic forms of Catholic spirituality. The university shall make provision for effective campus-ministry programs, including the celebration of the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and penance, other liturgical celebrations and opportunities for prayer and spiritual reflection.
- **Speakers Vetted:** The U.S. Bishops' 2004 "Catholics in Political Life": Catholic institutions should not honor those who act in defiance of our fundamental moral principles. They should not be given awards, honors or platforms that would suggest support for their actions.
- Unobjectionable Clubs: U.S. Application: It is important for Catholic universities to implement in practical terms their commitment to the essential elements of Catholic identity, including activities of officially recognized student and faculty organizations and associations.
- **No Coed Dorms:** *U.S. Application*: It is important for Catholic universities to implement in practical terms their commitment to the essential elements of Catholic identity, including the commitment to create a campus culture and environment that is expressive and supportive of a Catholic way of life.
- Health Services Okay: U.S. Application: It is important for Catholic universities to implement in practical terms their commitment to the essential elements of Catholic identity, including the commitment to provide health care in conformity with the Church's ethical and religious teaching and directives.

Theologians' Oath: The mandatum is the proper requirement for undergraduate faculty and institutions, and

we require it of all Catholic faculty members in theology. The "Profession of Faith" and "Oath of Fidelity" are more proper for pontifical faculties teaching in seminaries.

Coed Dorms: We have six residence halls. Five of the six are single-sex, and only one is coed. It is reserved for upperclassmen, and each floor is divided by men and women. Visitation policies are enforced in this hall. as they are in all of our residential halls. This upperclassmen residence hall provides those students who live there an opportunity to demonstrate the ability to live in an adult community while at the same time upholding themselves and their colleagues to excellence and virtue.







Theologians' Oath: The Catholic faculty recite the "Profession of Faith" in the presence of and along with the local bishop/chancellor and president at the opening Mass of each academic year. Catholic faculty have not been required to take the "Oath of Fidelity" because of the canonical mission/nihil obstat binding the ecclesiastical faculties. Dorms: Beginning in fall 2014, virtually all undergraduate students will reside in single-sex residence halls. In addition, three halls have religious in residence — two female residence halls have sisters living with students, and a priest lives in one of the male halls.



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
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

hile scores of colleges are expanding their curricula by narrowing specialties and fields of study, some top Catholic colleges are keeping liberal arts alive and well.

Presidents from such colleges shared their insights about the benefits of a liberal arts education for their students.

"It's ultimately responding to the desire of the Church," explained Timothy O'Donnell, president of Christendom College in Front Royal, Va., referring to Ex Corde Ecclesiae (On Catholic Universities), St. John Paul II's apostolic exhortation.

"This kind of education leads to the free man, the man who is selfdirected," he added. "If you really take the time to study, reflect, think and pray through the liberal arts and math, theology and history — and not to be enslaved by your passions or be carried away by any cultural fads, but only study the truth — it allows you to understand more deeply who you are as a human being and who God is and Christ is."

Through a liberal arts education, he contends, students can come to a deeper understanding of these truths and live based on these truths.

#### The Heart of Education

"It gives people the freedom to know who they are and to know something about God and the whole nature of order," O'Donnell said. "And that's the beauty of it: You can go on to do anything, but as a deeply educated and committed Roman Catholic."

O'Donnell said that this is the heart of Catholic education.

"Education is not just about getting a job, but forming the person and entering into the relation of the truth; for us Catholics, ultimately, that encounter is a Person, Jesus Christ," O'Donnell said. He cited Pope St. John Paul II, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI and Pope Francis as having clarified that education is for this higher purpose, not just to train man as a worker, but to have him recognize he has an immortal soul and eternal destiny.

"So many times, we make the mistake and overly limit study in a particular area," he said. "But to raise the most fundamental questions about why things are the way they are is part of a great adventure that starts and never really ends, until we get to the Beatific Vision."

## **Post-College Life**

Since Americans tend to be pragmatic, liberal arts even excels in this regard, he said, because studying the liberal arts really prepares one for many areas of post-college life.

Graduates who can think and write clearly and live a virtuous life are sought after by employers.

No matter what graduates choose to do, they have "a broad-based education that addresses the most fundamental questions to know who you are, grounded in ethics and virtues that help you to be good in whatever you choose to be," he concluded. "The liberal arts are speculative, but the impact they have on life is very valuable."

Michael McLean, the president of Thomas Aquinas College in Santa Paula, Calif., is of like mind.

He clarified what "liberal" means in this context.

"We use the term 'liberal' education from the Latin word liber, meaning 'free,' so this is an education ordered to freedom," he explained. "[It] means the ability for people to govern themselves in accord with natural law and in fidelity to the Gospel."

"Our Lord said, 'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life,' and 'The truth will make you free,' so there is a connection between Catholic liberal education and truth," McLean made clear. "In this case, truth is embodied in Jesus Christ, so the education here is really Christ-centered and Godcentered."

## **Logic and Truth**

Theology and philosophy are of central importance, he said. Learning logic and math habituates students to orderly thinking, reasoning and discourse, too.

"The liberal arts really provoke the kind of wonder in the heart and mind that is the starting point of Catholic intellectual life," he said. "The more students are encouraged

to wonder about the world and the beauty around them, the more they are motivated to pursue education."

"But first and most importantly," he observed, "since the curriculum is ordered to theology, one of the great benefits is the students really do grow in their knowledge and love of God. Related to that, they see in a profound way the harmony between faith and reason."

That vision is one of the challenges of our times, he said, because students exit college and enter a world where faith is under attack. But graduates are prepared because their "education is Christ-centered, but it's also skill-centered."

#### **Religious Vocations**

Students are actively engaged in classes that are conducted as conversations and discussions. They acquire analytical and conversational skills — traits employers look for in employees.

The large number of religious vocations to come of out of this college is another benefit of liberal arts education, McLean said, citing that 10% to 12% of the college's graduates enter religious life. About 59 graduates have become priests, and a large number have entered religious life.

Likewise, those who marry have family lives centered on Christ, and

they bring their strong Catholic faith to their work — "that is the heart of the New Evangelization," he said, "and the way the Church is going to evangelize the world: sending deeply committed Catholics into the secular world to remake that world in the image of Christ."

## 'Diakonia of Truth'

William Fahey, president of Thomas More College of Liberal Arts in Merrimack, N.H., explained that the college is committed to the liberal arts for several equally important reasons.

"First," he said, "we view ourselves as faithfully responding to the Church's long-standing desire that universities defend the Western patrimony and especially respond to the responsibility to uphold the diakonia of truth — the ministry of truth in defense of God's majesty and human dignity."

He observed that the liberal arts, as traditionally taught at such institutions as Thomas More, "faithfully introduce students to the theological, philosophical and humanistic



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
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
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

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
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# Committed to 'True Education'

Donnelly College's New President Shares Importance of Catholic Identity on Campus

ormerly the vice president for Catholic identity at Mount St. Mary's University, Msgr. Stuart Swetland is now president of Donnelly College in Kansas City, Kan. This year, Donnelly makes its debut in the Register's Catholic Identity College Guide. Msgr. Swetland spoke with the Register a few weeks after he took the helm of Donnelly on July 1.

How did you discern your new role as college president?

I had been at Mount St. Mary's for eight years and felt it was time to look for what else God was calling me to. I was nominated for the position here, and so I looked at Donnelly and liked what I learned. I think Donnelly is answering Pope Francis' challenge for the Church to serve those who might not otherwise be served. This is the type of approach Pope Francis is calling us to — to reach out to those on the margins so they can share in the intellectual tradition of the Church and discover how they are called to serve Christ. We like to say that if Donnelly didn't exist, we would have to build it.

How has your background as a college chaplain and professor prepared you for your new job?

Being a college president is like the role of a pastor. I am the spiritual father and chief academic officer. It takes into account my reputation in academic life and pastoral service in the spiritual life, with integration of faith and reason. Being a college president is a full-time endeavor, but I will still do my radio and TV work [as host of EWTN's Catholicism on Campus]. I am excited as I go to meetings and meet people who love what they do: I want to be part of it.

The Donnelly mission statement is: "Donnelly College is a Catholic institution of higher education that seeks to continue the mission of Jesus Christ in our time by making the love of God tangible in our world. Specifically, the mission of Donnelly College is to provide education and community services with personal concern for the needs and abilities of each student, especially those who might not otherwise be served." How do you envision building upon it?

I am excited about the mission statement. The whole role of Catholics and baptized Christians is to continue the mission of Jesus Christ — to reveal the merciful love of the Father — and we share that mission. Donnelly College makes it tangible to those seeking a higher education. Eighty-four percent of our students are first-generation college students; 71% are at the lowest socioeconomic levels, many of them minorities. Service is part of that. Our freshmen seminar focuses on service learning; they participate in a service project. From Day 1, they know that "to whom much is given, much is expected" (Luke 12:48), and they give

back. We make the merciful love of God present. I help my staff and students to make the love of God known

Last year, you wrote a feature for our College Guide about the importance of peer evangelization, catechesis for college staff and courses that weave together subject matter and faith. How do you hope to implement these ideas at Donnelly?

Donnelly College serves an urban core population. Fifty-five percent of our students are Catholic. We give witness as we educate first-generation students and show the many ways of radiating Jesus to the world, while providing a Catholic education that is relatively inexpensive for those who might not otherwise go to college. We are where success gets its start — in education and the spiritual life whether it is to finish a high-school degree or take remedial work and then begin in college for an associate's or bachelor's degree. We also have a program in Lansing prison with inmates, helping them in their rehabilitation.

We serve and see Christ in those underserved. We integrate Christ into our curriculum, providing a holistic education. Our core courses include fundamental theology, which looks at the fundamental questions of belief: who Christ is and what salvation is.

We have ongoing formation for everyone. Many of our students come from immigrant backgrounds, and we look at how we as a Church and college can support them. We have a campus minister, Father John Melnick — his job is like my former role as vice president of Catholic identity. Between the two of us, we are able to do campus ministry. We have daily Mass, regular confession times and Bible studies — all that you would expect for a Catholic college and all integrating faith and reason.

How does your understanding of John Paul II's Ex Corde Ecclesiae aid your commitment to Catholic identity?

Two aspects: commitment to the truth and serving the underserved. *Ex Corde* says we need Catholic universities that are wholly dedicated

to the truth. We want to radiate that: The role of a college or university is to be wholly consecrated to the truth. All professors who teach theology take the *mandatum* [stating they will teach according to the magisterium]. Donnelly does that well. *Ex Corde* also calls us not to exclude: We are proud to help make possible an education for those in the lower socioeconomic hierarchy and who have other barriers to an education.

"Excellence in the pursuit of truth" is one of Donnelly's "Student Learning Goals." How do truth and learning go hand-in-hand?

There is a struggle in the secular world to see that truth is knowable and, ultimately, a Person: Jesus Christ. We discover who we are in encountering the Lord. We are unapologetic that the truth is knowable and is a Person, Jesus the Christ. We truly educate: It's not indoctrination and not just training. True education is the formation of the person to recognize what is true and how to think well. We form men and women who can research, analyze texts, make arguments and express their thoughts in writing and speech — they are able to share the truth, whether as part of English, history, theology, etc.


What advice do you have for college students about keeping their faith and pursuing God's will?

There's the old slogan I used at St. John's Catholic Newman Center [at the University of Illinois, where he was chaplain] — it wears well — "Study hard, and pray harder" to discover who you are and what God is calling you to do. Pray so you know God's will. I think of my mom and dad. Because I knew them so well, I knew what they wanted, what their will was for me. In a similar way, when we draw close to the Lord, we discover his will: what will make him — and us — happiest. "In his will is our peace," as Dante put it. God created us with a purpose in mind. We are all called to holiness. What does Scripture say about Christ? "He grew in age, grace and wisdom" (Luke 2:52) — we all are; that includes our state of life and the particular vocation that God wants for us.

What else would you like our readers to know about Donnelly?

A lot of people don't know it exists — it is a well-kept secret. It is one of 11 diocesan colleges in the United States. It has a Benedictine flavor, due to its history, being founded by the Benedictine Sisters [of Atchison, Kan., and Bishop George Donnelly]. The Archdiocese of Kansas City is committed to the Church and the college. We're one of those Catholic schools that John Paul II, Benedict and, now, Francis have called us to be committed to.





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# Mild, Mild West Adventure

Wyoming Catholic Philosophy Professor Finds That Rustic Tranquility Facilitates Christian Life

ife on many college campuses today is anything but tranquil. Wyoming Catholic College (WCC) has the answer to the problem, according to Peter Kwasniewski, professor of philosophy and theology and one of the school's founding faculty members. The college, founded in 2005, offers a quiet, rural location, small class sizes and an unusually disciplined technology policy. (For example, students are not allowed to use cellphones on campus.)

Kwasniewksi spoke of the state of Catholic higher education, sacred music and getting a bilingual edition of the complete works of St. Thomas Aquinas in print.

With all of your academic experience, what do you think are the top challenges for Catholic institutions of higher learning today?

There are many challenges, but I will name two. The first is curricular integrity and depth. It is very tempting for institutions to follow the conventions and assumptions of our day — for example, by conceiving of higher education as glorified job training, rather than seeing it as a profound formation of the mind and heart, as the Catholic Tradition views it.

Catholic schools have an irreplaceable vocation to bring an intellectual and spiritual patrimony of two millennia into the lives of their students, and this is not something that will happen by chance or luck. It needs to be carefully built into the mission, the curriculum, the campus life, the chaplaincy and then pursued with great clarity and zeal.

The second challenge is related to the first: convincing parents, and even clergy, that there is nothing more important for young men and women than attending a college or university that will actually strengthen their faith, feed their minds with natural and supernatural truths and help them lead a moral life in conformity with the Gospel

Questions of prestige and getting a good job are radically secondary to the one thing needful, which is following Jesus Christ with all of our powers of body and soul. He promised us that when we put his kingdom first, he will provide for all of our other

needs, at the right time and in his own way.

The college years are a unique and crucial time of personal growth, and no amount of schooling prior to college — even the best home schooling or private preparatory school — can replace the need for an authentically Catholic college education for anyone who plans to continue on to that level. It is a special time when many young men and women will either mature into self-aware and self-motivated disciples of Christ or fall away into confusion, turpitude and apostasy.

Wyoming Catholic College is a very small school. What are the pluses and minuses of such a small institution?

To be honest, I mainly see huge pluses for student life. ... At WCC, as at TAC [Thomas Aquinas College, which he attended], you have many fellow students who are serious in their faith and intellectual commitment, and you develop deep friendships that will last a lifetime.

You also have teachers who genuinely care about you and (for instance) invite you over to their homes for meals, music or readings, with fascinating conversations about all sorts of things. It can sound trite to say that the students here are like a family, but when you experience it firsthand, you

can see that it's quite true: It is a family, a band of brothers working side-by-side, studying, praying, hiking, learning to be fully and joyfully alive. This is the kind of life that I wish every young Catholic could live

Speaking as a teacher, I enjoy being in an integrated liberal arts program where I have the opportunity to teach across the curriculum, deepening my understanding of all areas of theology, philosophy, music and beyond. The faculty here are continually in conversation about great books, great works of art and how to lead the students into the knowledge and love of the truth. My teaching stimulates my writing, and my serving as the school's choirmaster stimulates my activities as a composer.

As the pace of society continues to speed up, do you find the slower pace in Wyoming to be a great blessing?

It is indeed. There's a saying that has a lot of truth to it: "Wyoming is what America was." Quite apart from its tremendous natural beauty, our local community has more genuine human and personal character to it than any other I've been a part of.

Our college didn't end up in Lander, Wyo., by accident; it was a very deliberate decision of the founders. Being here in the great, open West, in a small town with a slow pace, makes an ideal environment for living out an integrally Catholic life and for developing the moral and intellectual virtues that perfect a man or woman from within.

And I believe we are making a good use of that "great blessing" you mentioned. Over meals or in their spare time, people hold real conversations about worthwhile things instead of texting or chattering on their phones about ephemera. They do adventurous things in the great outdoors, "God's First Book." When taking a break, the students recite poetry, play sports or sing songs.

WCC is a genuine community of people who love each other, are animated by a noble purpose and still know how to have fun. It sounds strange to say it, but there are fewer and fewer places in the modern world where any of this happens.

You released a book earlier this year called Sacred Choral Works. Can you say a little about this book and who would benefit most from it?

Although my main work has been that of a professor of philosophy and theology, I've also been heavily involved over the past 25 years with music — cantoring, directing choirs and composing, especially for church choirs. I decided last year to collect the best of my compositions, with the aim of making them more widely available. Corpus Christi Watershed was excited about the project and helped me bring it to completion. The book, containing 85 pieces, was published earlier this year. I've been delighted by the reception: Some of my Masses, motets and hymns have already been included in the repertoire of choirs around the country, and even abroad.

The style of the music is inspired by Gregorian chant and classic polyphony, which constitute the core repertoire and best models of sacred music (see *Sacrosanctum Concilium* [SC], 116); the texts, in Latin and in English, are Catholic through and through, drawing upon Scripture, liturgy and Tradition; and the pieces vary in difficulty, so that there is something for every size and skill level of choir (SC, 121). Vatican II clearly said that "choirs must be diligently promoted" (SC, 114) and that "composers, filled with the Christian spirit, should feel that their vocation is to cultivate sacred music and increase

its store of treasures" (*SC*, 121). This is what I have tried to do, in order to contribute to the renewal of the liturgy in our times, in accordance with the luminous teaching of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI.

You've stated that Christ is formed in the soul through sacred music. What exactly do you mean by that?


The style of our Church music and the texts used by it will shape our souls, our worship and our faith. Who God is for us, what his message is to us and how we will respond to it are all conveyed by that music. If it is holy, artistically sound and universal, it will be a theology of the holiness and beauty of Jesus Christ, the Savior of all mankind.

You are part of a budding enterprise called The Aquinas Institute for the Study of Sacred Doctrine, which is publishing the complete works of St. Thomas Aquinas. Why are you enthusiastic about this project?

The Aquinas Institute, based here in Lander, is working on a project that has never been done before: a *complete* bilingual edition of the works of St. Thomas Aquinas. For 700 years, the Church has lauded St. Thomas as the best guide in the study of philosophy and theology — and these accolades continue in the documents of Vatican II and the magisteriums of John Paul II and Benedict XVI. And yet, bizarrely, only a few of his works have been readily and affordably available in Latin *or* in English, let alone in bilingual editions.

Our goal over the next years is to bring out a total of 57 volumes, all in hardcover, that give the reader access to all the original texts as well as good translations. Naturally, this will involve translating a number of things that have never appeared in English before, and I am happy to say that we have the enthusiastic cooperation of scholars from around the country who are working simultaneously on those various translations. ... In many ways, this work is an extension of our work as professors at Wyoming Catholic College, where the principles underlying our entire curriculum are drawn from St. Thomas and where the disciplines of philosophy and theology in particular are deeply shaped by his insights and often feature his writings.

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
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
