






## HOME SWEET HOME IS ANYTHING BUT SWEET

### Poor Haitian children must work to help feed and shelter their families

**HAITI** - The tiny tin shack is suffocating inside, hot as an oven beneath the blazing sun. This is home for Ellen, 12, whose family has been nomads since the 2010 earthquake destroyed their home. Like the children of Israel, they moved constantly, wandering through Haiti while searching for a permanent home. They found refuge on an empty parcel of land in Ca Ira with other families, but the landowner has threatened to evict Ellen's family and others who are squatting on his property.

The dark, stifling interior of Ellen's shanty lacks a sturdy door, which means strangers could easily break inside and harm the young girl.

Ellen sleeps on the ground on a thin rag mat. Rain leaks through the rickety roof and turns the ground into a soggy, muddy mess.

To help her family earn money for food, Ellen nimbly strips apart used rice bags they find in the trash. Her grandmother, Charitable, weaves the strands into ropes. On market day, they will sell the ropes, which local Haitians use to tie up donkeys, making less than \$1.

#### MATERIALLY POOR BUT RICH IN SPIRIT

Ellen's family and other families in the community barely survive by sharing their meager blessings with each other and sharing a faith that is much more solid than the flimsy hovels sheltering them.



Ellen and her family harbor hope for a better tomorrow. Charitable leads the family in prayer every night. She is a woman of deep faith who trusts in God's goodness and mercy.

"We get on our knees and pray that someone will help us. We wait for God to take us out of our misery," Charitable said.

It is the spirit of sharing and their faith in God that has enabled Ellen and her family to survive in these harsh conditions. Their faith is their rock and their comfort.

"When we don't have anything we get something from our neighbors. God says to share what you have, so when you have something you share it," said Charitable. "We all live together, and we are all poor together."

Yvon, a community leader, marvels at the deep faith of the people of Ca Ira. Despite their precarious living situation, the families put all their trust in God.

## Guadalupe Mysteries Showcases Our Lady's Miraculous Image in Fact and Photograph

uadalupe Mysteries: Deciphering the Code presents the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe in page-turning fashion.

It comes from the author-photographer team of Grzegorz Górny and Janusz Rosikon, who gave readers the unforgettable Witness to Mystery: Investigations Into Christ's Relics.

The oversized book overflows with illustrations in visual varieties of every kind. The gamut runs from Rosikon's eye-catching photography to colorful, painted masterpieces and murals, centuries-old illustrations, scientific close-ups, drawings and more. Visual delights appear page after page.


This "armchair pilgrimage" reads easily as it takes readers through the mysteries of the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe and how her appearance and image converted an entire culture and country and continues to have an impact through five centuries, in Mexico and around the globe. We're reminded that the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico is the most-visited Marian shrine in the world, welcoming an estimated 20 million people yearly.

The authors present facts with illustrations in a riveting way, helping readers to understand the astounding discoveries expert scientists and doctors have made in examining, for example, the eyes of Our Lady, or how the image on the tilma is one of three examples of acheiropoietos — "not made by human hands."

One fascinating section brings to light how Father Mario Rojas Sanchez "assumed that as the image was sort of a message, some parts intelligible to the Indians, other parts to the Europeans, then it might well contain certain information that was decipherable scientifically. ... The layout of the mountain flowers on Our Lady's tunic intrigued him; he wondered if the layout matched any patterns in nature."

The book reveals what he found when he placed a map of Mexico on the image: "Our Lady of Guadalupe has become part of the Mexican landscape, an intrinsic part of the land. A new Son has been born of her womb, hence a new era in world history."

The authors also put the miracle in historical context. so that readers can better understand the tremendous amount of swift conversions - on some days, 15,000 were baptized. Not only did they come for baptism by the thousands, but the native people would walk for days to go to confession! What a les-



son they teach us today.

To further put the appearance of Our Lady into historical perspective, the authors take readers back to Spain and the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, in the Spanish province of Extramadura, which was even visited by Christopher Columbus. They also weave in background information about the Mayan and Aztec cultures to better understand what this powerful, instantaneous mass conversion would mean.

Another highlight is a short translation of Juan Diego's poetic words in the Nican Mopohua, the oldest historical source written by an Indian who knew Juan Diego. Also included: beautiful photographs of the church built over the birthplace of Juan Diego and a two-page panorama that includes the new cathedral and the original church on Tepeyac, all in one wonderful frame.

On his 1999 Mexico trip, St. John Paul II proclaimed Our Lady of Guadalupe "Star of the New Evangelization." Readers will come to fully understand that title, too, after reading Guadalupe Mysteries.






## Elizabeth of the Trinity, Our Newest Saint

lizabeth of the Trinity was a Carmelite nun who died at the beginning of the 20th century at the age of 26. Born in an army camp in 1880, the oldest of two sisters, her father was a veteran and POW of the Franco-Prussian War who died while she was still a child. Her mother had a conversion experience before her marriage and was zealous to live a pious life, and she was very loving and extremely devoted to her daughters. She moved the family to Dijon a few blocks from the parish Church of Saint-Michel — and just across the street from the Carmelite monastery Elizabeth would someday join. Josephine Catez raised her children around piano lessons, home schooling and involvement in the parish. It was in this context that Elizabeth discovered her devotion to Christ and learned how to control herself. She, in fact, had a fiery temper, but learned through prayer how to submit this to God with love.

Her devotion to Christ and to mental prayer impressed her friends and the nuns of her community even before she entered. As a teenager, she self-identified with St. Teresa of Avila's descriptions of the prayer of union. She was also among the first to read an early version of St. Thérèse of Lisieux's Story of a Soul. After read-

of the Trinity reminds us of God's power to establish in us a profound and peaceful stillness. She reminds us that the Trinity is our home and that God has created us in order to be united to Christ. ing this work, she resolved to be a Carmelite nun. She came to see herself as the Bride of Christ, as the beloved of the Canticle of Canticles, who cries out, "Nescivi! I no longer know anything but confor-

than causing her to be indifferent to others, moved her to implicate herself in the faith life and everyday struggles of her friends and family. As her death from Addison's disease grew closer, the more lovingly aware she became of their need for a deeper encounter with the Lord.

She promised that it would increase her joy in heaven if her friends asked for her help, and she was convinced that her mission was to help souls grow into a transforming union with God. In particular, she believed that she would be instrumental in leading souls out of self-occupation and into a beautiful silence where they might encounter the Lord and surrender themselves to him completely.

Through confidence in the love of God and complete abandonment to his will, the transformation that she envisioned leads to adoration and praise. She described a simple movement of love in response to the pure excess of divine love that awaits us. This love suffers, but is, in Christ, unvanquished. The victory of love realized in Christ allows us to know the glory of God and the joy of praising him. In her thought, God has predestined us in Christ to be the praise of his glory. She, in fact, believed the name that God gave her from heaven to be Laudem Gloriae ("Unto the Praise of Glory"). At the same time, she made it her mission to make sure that everyone else realized this great vocation, as

well — in the particular way that God himself had called them.

The first step towards this, she proposed, is to occupy oneself with the love of the Holy Trinity: to recognize and to ponder the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as a bosom of eternal love and, at the same time, our true home, the place where we are meant to dwell.

Such an awareness of a personal relationship with the Trinity requires mindfulness of the purpose for which we are made. For her, we are created to welcome the excessive love of God and allow him to satiate his desire to love us.

The reality of heaven is not something that she believed was in the future of Christian existence, but already in this present moment in time. God's love comes to us in ever-new ways through Christ Jesus, the Word of the Father, whom the Father continually sends into our hearts with the fire of the Holy Spirit. With this dynamic view of the Trinity in each moment of life, she believed everything was a sacrament that gave us God and that time itself was "eternity begun and still in progress."













Did Vatican II do away with veils?








#### **Brother Francis: The Barefoot Saint of Assisi**



## YOU: New Project Helps Teens Learn God's Plan for Love

Ascension Press DVD Series Offers Timeless Wisdom From St. John Paul II, as Explained by Popular Youth Speakers

ow can we get teenagers to care about the important things like chastity and love especially love?

Is there a key to reaching them on the deepest level so that they will guard their hearts and souls and live out God's plan for love?

The beauty of divine truth might just grab their attention if they understood that it is the very key to their happiness.

YOU: Life, Love and Theology of the Body does that — and does it exceptionally well. It is a 10-week DVD series with a cast of some of the most popular speakers for young people. They talk about what it means to be a man or woman, confess some very personal mistakes (honestly yet tastefully), and impart what it means to protect the beauty and dignity of the human person.

The series is grounded in St. John Paul II's talks on theology of the body and his book Love and Responsibility. It opens with Ennie Hickman, president of Adore Ministries, asking, "Why do we care so much what people think about us? Why do we work so hard to fit in?" He explains that, regardless of what others think, we were created good in the eyes of God, and we cannot lose his love — no matter what we wear or what we do.

Brian Butler, co-founder of Dumb Ox Ministries, talks about pursuing love and admits he once cared more about the body than the person. "God made us for love," he said. "Pope John Paul II said that man cannot live without love; his life is senseless without it."

"It was God who gave us the desires that lead to relationships," Butler stated. If we are going to build good relationships based on



love, Butler said, we need discernment to make good choices and to pursue the good of another person.

Jason and Crystalina Evert, founders of the Chastity Project, speak about their own past and invite kids to join them in a beautiful future. Jason explained that John Paul II was called the "Eternal Teenager" because he loved to hike with groups of young people. They often asked him questions about such things as love and relationships. "Of those 60 teens that used to hike with him, none of them ever got a divorce," Jason said. "If we discover what he was telling them, it's obvious why."

"God is obsessed with the human heart," according to Jason, "because whoever wins the heart wins everything. ... Purity isn't being numb to God's creation of masculinity and femininity, but lust will cover up the absence of love."

He explains that St. John Paul taught that chastity is the sure way to happiness.

Crystalina shared her experience in high school of confusing love with using people. She explained that when she met her husband, Jason, the difference was like night and day: "Our purity was our superglue." The type of love they had was safe and genuine, Crystalina said. "I knew he wanted what was best for me. He was taking me closer to God, not away from God."

Rapper-priest Father Josh Johnson talks about building virtues to overcome vices and warns young people to pay attention to media choices. "Listening to sexually inappropriate music: It's going to get us to think about lust rather than Baby Jesus," he said. "We were created to abide with Jesus Christ in our hearts. Music can communicate truth, but it can also communicate lies through relativism."

Homosexuality, marriage, natural family planning, the priesthood and consecrated life are all discussed in this program to help form teenagers in Catholic truth.

As Father Johnson explains, "Truth and freedom either go hand and hand together or they perish in misery. Sin cannot satisfy us in the depths of our hearts. ... We were created for virtue and freedom from our vices. ... God gives us the strength, and all things are possible through his grace."


